# PLAYER EVALUATIONS FAQ'S 2017/2018

## How do I know what evaluation session to bring my daughter to?

If your daughter is trying out for either PeeWee Rep (A1), Bantam Rep (A1) or Midget Rep (A1), please bring her to All sessions that have an A1 after the division name (ie. PeeWee A1). To be on the "try-out" list you would have indicated during registration or to our Registrar and paid the appropriate "try-out" fee. You need to be on the "try-out" list to attend the "A1" sessions.

If your daughter is not trying out for the above named teams, please bring her to all sessions, in her division, which have a C1, C2 or C3 after them.

If your daughter is a goalie, she will need to attend the appropriate goalie session as well as all games in the division she is being evaluated in.

If you daughter is a Tyke or Novice you DO NOT have any evaluation sessions to attend this year.

## Does my daughter have to be evaluated?

No, if your daughter is new to hockey or you do not want her to participate in evaluations, please request through your division coordinator and we will automatically place her on the Tier 2 or 3 team (depending on division)

## Why do you evaluate players?

The purpose of the evaluation process is to ensure that the girls are placed on a team that appropriately matches their hockey skills. In almost all cases, Pacific Coast Amateur Hockey Association (PCAHA) dictates that teams are tiered, in fewer cases we may balance teams, this would most likely be in divisions with 4 or more teams.

#### Who evaluates the players?

This year there will be a 3 person panel consisting of the interim head coach and two evaluators from Inside Edge.

### Who evaluates the goalies?

This year there will be a 2 person panel consisting of the interim head coach and one evaluator from Magic Hockey

#### What is an Eval Practice?

An evaluation practice is a planned practice, appropriate for each division, where our evaluators can assess skills performed in a number of different drills including skating mobility, puck movement/control, shooting, offensive ability, defensive ability.

#### What is an Evaluation Game?

This is a scrimmage where our evaluators can assess team play for the division being viewed. The areas of observation include skating, puck movement/control, offensive ability, defensive ability, hockey sense.

## What if my daughter tries out for a 1 or Rep team and gets released?

She will then attend all sessions in the 2/3 or 2/3/4 portion of her division. The previous evaluation information will not move with her, the process will start over with the peers in that group.

### How will my daughter know if she continues with the 1 or Rep team or is being released to the 2/3 or 2/3/4 process?

We will post information via our website on try-out information. Your division coordinator will be ensuring you are receiving the appropriate information
