Tournament Update (by Darren Ferris)

- ✓ It was shaping up to be an amazing tournament.
- ✓ All house teams except 2
- ✓ We had 3 teams from San Diego and other away teams
- ✓ Positive that we have our tournament later in the year, perhaps things may be better by then
- ✓ We have lots of carry-overs to use for next year's tournament
- ✓ Such an amazing group of volunteers
- ✓ We need more people to step up for next year's tournament

Treasurer's Report: The balance sheet as of April 23th, 2019 and the Proposed Budget for next season were presented. Our fiscal year end is May 31st. Please see attached budget sheet.

Naomi highlighted some items on this season's budget:

- ✓ Our tournament has been our main fundraising event so there will be a loss here; we should be ok if our tournament goes ahead next year
- ✓ Spirt of Coquitlam Grant was given to us from the City of Coquitlam, thanks to Heather Fox's application
- Main registration (line 7) is our main revenue (with our own camp/rust removal, we were successful to gaining a small revenue led by Agnes Pau, late fees, try-out fees
- ✓ Our largest Expense: Gaming Grant goes directly to paying Ice Rental Expenses
- ✓ Credit Card Charges (large number, but it's a competitive rate for credit card processing)
- ✓ Discounts: AGM discount for one lucky registrant, 3rd child discount, and full-time Goalies
- ✓ Even though we don't know if we'll get the Gaming Grant, we need to keep it in the budget.
- Reserve Draw Down is budgeted to be higher than usual this year because of the situation with Covid-19
- ✓ Hockey equipment's budget line is down for next year, as this year we bought hockey equipment for TRY-IT, as well as replacing Juvenile jerseys. We have been choosing one division to replace jerseys each year.
- We will have to be flexible with the upcoming budget if we get more registration it will be higher and if we get lower registration then the budget will be lower (line 18 BC Hockey, line 20 credit card charges, line 26 PCHA dues will all be fluctuating based on registration)

Questions regarding the 20-21 Budget

- Question was asked about why the PCHA and BC Hockey dues are down for next year.
- Player Development: Fire and Ice-we increased number of coaches on the ice, Goalies also increased development. We went a bit over last year, so we will continue with that budget as that *has* and *is* a priority for our players
- Should we be looking at adding to our Contingency plan knowing this could be a different season? Right now we
 don't need to look at adding right now. With our tournament, we were set to make \$30,000. This is why we have the
 contingency fund.
- Player Evaluations went down this year. Why did we change this year? Yes, last year's was performed by Global
 Sport Testing and was more expensive as well as bigger numbers. With trying to be prudent and cut costs we are
 going to look at other options taking into account other year's budgets. Again, these things could change. We need to
 wait for directives.
- What was the reasoning for changing the evaluations and the development for this past year both of which cost more
 and were over budget. With Development, we put tender back out to the communities to survey development
 providers. We got responses back and based on several factors we opted to go with a new provider. The extra
 instructor was added with our larger teams as well as increasing goalie development for teams. Every few years we
 need to evaluate how we do things, which included evaluations.

After some questions were asked regarding the 2020 – 2021 budget. Poll was taken via Zoom and Motion was carried, and budget was approved for 2020-2021 fiscal period.
