Last season I researched and sought almost \$10,000 of much needed goalie equipment by sending proposals to vendors and receiving the most competitive costs.

Lastly, I've organized TCFIHA's first spring goalie development. I coordinated the ice time and secured VEIT to provide our on ice development. Thus providing our goalies with continued training opportunities.

In summary, in 2024/2025, I was able to grow the goalie program in the younger divisions, thus securing more goalie in future senior seasons. I obtained new gear for our goalies and attended almost every development session on top of my Head Coaching responsibilities. VEIT Goaltending and I have a strong working relationship and I'm hosting the first TCFIHA spring goalie development.
